	In this research, I have aimed to realize a new machine learning model for identifying influential users			
Research Outline And Result	towards National Election campaigns among Social Networking Service. The Features of this system			
	is to detect influential users automatically and integrating causality computation to represent the opinion			
	leaders effect and condition of its substances in human knowledge domain. The objective of this research			
	is to construct a new integrated system from short contexts (called tweets) on Twitter, that can			
	automatically detect influential users and representing its behavioral patterns in statistical analysis.			
	Clearly, some people exert considerable influence within Social Networking Service (SNS).			
	Some people tweet quite often, others manage multiple accounts and pretending to be independent of			
	each other. The purpose of this research is to detect such influential users and identify their behavior			
	within SNS.			
	The key technology of this research has been to apply the contexts data labeled by Three Experts of			
	Political Science worked for 167 hours (total) to offer knowledge and skills of social listening and to			
	categorize in political professionals for the purpose of improving accuracy of detecting influential users.
